She saw a group of birds flying overhead. Winnie smiled. She knew that she could fly too, and she couldn't wait to go on another adventure.



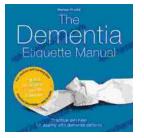
